Van die Burgemeester From the Mayor

Lieve Inwoners

Dit is altyd lekker om te sien hoe ons groot projekte voltooi word. Baie van ons projekte strek oor jare en dit gebeur soms dat ons nie eerstehands die eindproduk kan sien of ervaar nie. Daarom was ek in absolute ekstase toe die Stellenbosch rioolsuiweringsaanleg onlangs voltooi is en ten volle in werking gestel is. Die nuwe aanleg is werkelik 'n indrukwekkende fasiliteit en een van die grootste rioolaansuiweringswerke in die land.

Die opening van die aanleg is 'n groot hoogtepunt vir my as Burgemeester. Aan die begin van my termyn in 2016, kon die bestaande fasiliteit nie meer aan die behoeftes van die dorp kon voldoen nie. Dit het 'n ernstige 'n ekonomiese en ekologiese impak gehad op die area. Ons het ingespring en onmiddellik noodmaatreëls in plek geplaas, om die kapasiteit van die fasiliteit tydelik te vergroot terwyl ons met die konstruksie en opgradering van die nuwe fasiliteit begin het.

Vandag kan ons opreg spog met 'n wêreldklas suiweringsaanleg wat gebruik maak van innoverende tegnologie. Dit is die grootste kapitaalprojek in die dorp se geskiedenis en het R 394 miljoen gekos (BTW uitgesluit). Die nuwe fasiliteit maak gebruik van UV

Dear Residents,

It is always great to see when our really large projects are completed. Many of our projects stretches across several years and it sometimes happen that we never get to see or experience the end result first hand. That is why I was absolutely ecstatic when the Stellenbosch Waste Water Treatment Works was recently completed and taken into full operation. The new facility is a truly impressive and one of the largest facilities of its kind in the country.

The opening of the new facility is a significant highlight for me as Mayor. At the start of my term in 2016, the existing facility at the time was completely insufficient for the needs of the town. It had a serious impact on the ecology and economy of the area. We made haste and took immediate action to put emergency measures in place to temporarily increase the capacity of the facility while we started with the construction of a new facility.

Today we can proudly boast with a world class water treatment facility that makes use of innovative technology. It is the biggest capital project in the history of Stellenbosch costing R 394 million, (excluding VAT). The new facility makes use of UV disinfection technology and uses a biological membrane reactor, an advanced

ontsmettingstegnologie en beskik oor 'n biologiese membraan reaktor, 'n gevorderde ultrafiltrasie membraan wat 'n beter gehalte eindproduk lewer, meer energie effekief is en ook meer omgewingsvriendelik is.

Die fasiliteit sluit ook 'n nuwe laboratorium in met opgeleide personeel wat deurlopend sorg dat ons watergehalte asook die suiweringsaanleg ten alle tye van hoogstaande gehalte is. Gaan maak gerus 'n draai, en laat my weet wat u dink.

We recently had the immense privilege to host the Western Cape cabinet for its #FirstThursday event. Residents who have previously participated in #FirstThursday's in the metro, may be familiar with the concept.

Every first Thursday of the month, various museums and art galleries open their doors to the public in the evening, and this draws large amounts of visitors. The Premier, Mr Alan Winde has taken part in this event for years, and opens up his offices at every event so that residents can come and speak directly to him and his officials, without the need to make an appointment. Following the elections last year, the Premier expanded the concept and included the entire provincial cabinet to participate in #FirstThursday. This year the Premier and cabinet decided to take the

#FirstThursday concept on the road and Stellenbosch was one of the first municipalities, outside of the metro, to welcome the Premier and the Ministers.

It was a wonderful event, conducted at Rietenbosch Primary School, where residents could come and talk directly to the decision makers in the province. Every provincial minister manned his/her own table and where the minister could not be present, the head of the relevant department assisted residents. Every person who attended had the opportunity to talk with the ministers and/or the officials. The Municipality also had a table and myself, members of the Mayoral Committee and senior officials met with our residents and answered questions.

I want to thank the Premier and the Cabinet on behalf of all our residents for the effort they made to come and talk to our residents.

In June the Provincial Department of Sport and Cultural Affairs will visit the municipality and launch their oral history initiative. This project will be rolled out through our local libraries and more information will be made available as we finalise the details. As South Africans, we have a strong tradition of storytelling and most of our stories are passed on through retelling. With the increase in technology, we do however run the risk that the stories from our story tellers get lost, if we do not write it down. Please help us to capture these stories. I know first-hand how incredible the knowledge and stories from our residents in all our towns are, and how well they remember the stories from long ago. It is so important that we remember and capture these stories for the next generation!

Our residents are always busy with wonderful new initiatives to improve our environment, our world and to create unique new opportunities. The new Spekboom Labyrinth, just outside Stellenbosch on East Hill Farm, will be one of the world’s largest labyrinths and the biggest in South Africa as well as in Africa. This project

Die ontwerpers van die labirint het die Spekboom gekies omdat dit, volgens navorsing, ‘n ongelooflike vermoë het om CO₂ uit die atmosfeer uit te onttrek en te omskep in suurstof. Dit is ook ‘n waterslim plant wat droeer toestande goed kan oorleef. Die boompies is verskaf deur plaaslike inwoners wat dit gekweek het, en skep dus ook so ‘n geleentheid vir inkomste vir ons plaaslike gemeenskappe. Die labirint gaan ongeveer 5 km se staproetes wees, en gaan stappers, rolstoele en fietsryers kan akkommodeer. Dis werklik merkwaardig.

The designers of the labyrinth chose the Spekboom a.k.a Elephant Bush because research has shown that it has an incredible ability to absorb CO₂ from the atmosphere and release oxygen back into the air. It is also a water wise plant that survives well in times of drought. The saplings are provided by local residents and in that way this project also created income for local communities. The labyrinth will include approximately 5 km in routes and will be accessible to hikers, wheel chairs and cyclists. It is truly impressive.
