MSA Section 25(1)(a)(b)

Each municipal council must, within a prescribed period after the start of its elected term, **adopt a single, inclusive and strategic plan for the development of the municipality which –**

(a) links, integrates and co-ordinates plans and takes into account proposals for the development of the municipality; and

(b) aligns the resources and capacity of the municipality with the implementation of the plan.



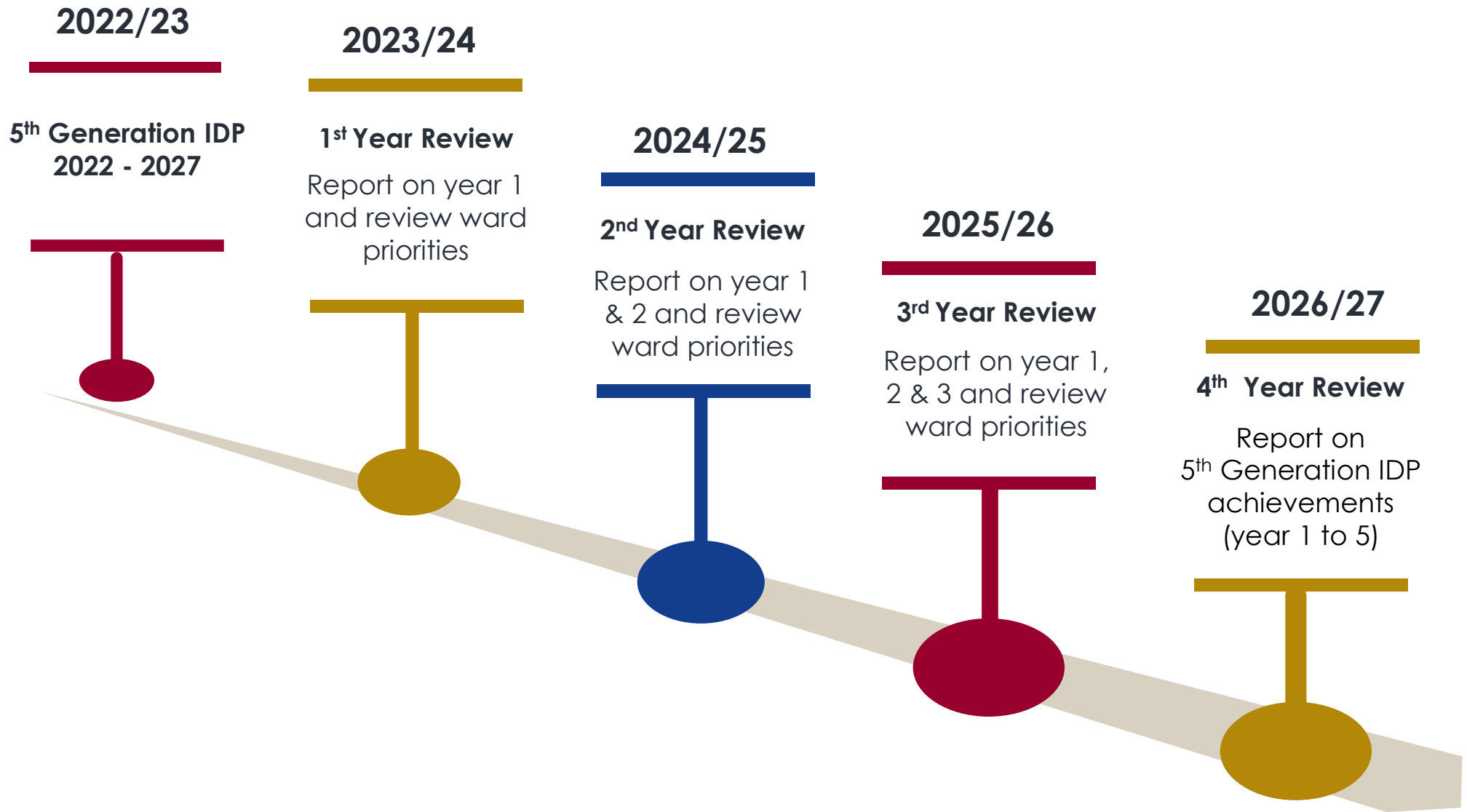
MSA Section 29(1)(b)

The process followed by a municipality to draft its Integrated Development Plan, including its consideration and adoption of the draft plan, must through appropriate mechanisms, processes and procedures established in terms of Chapter 4, allow for –

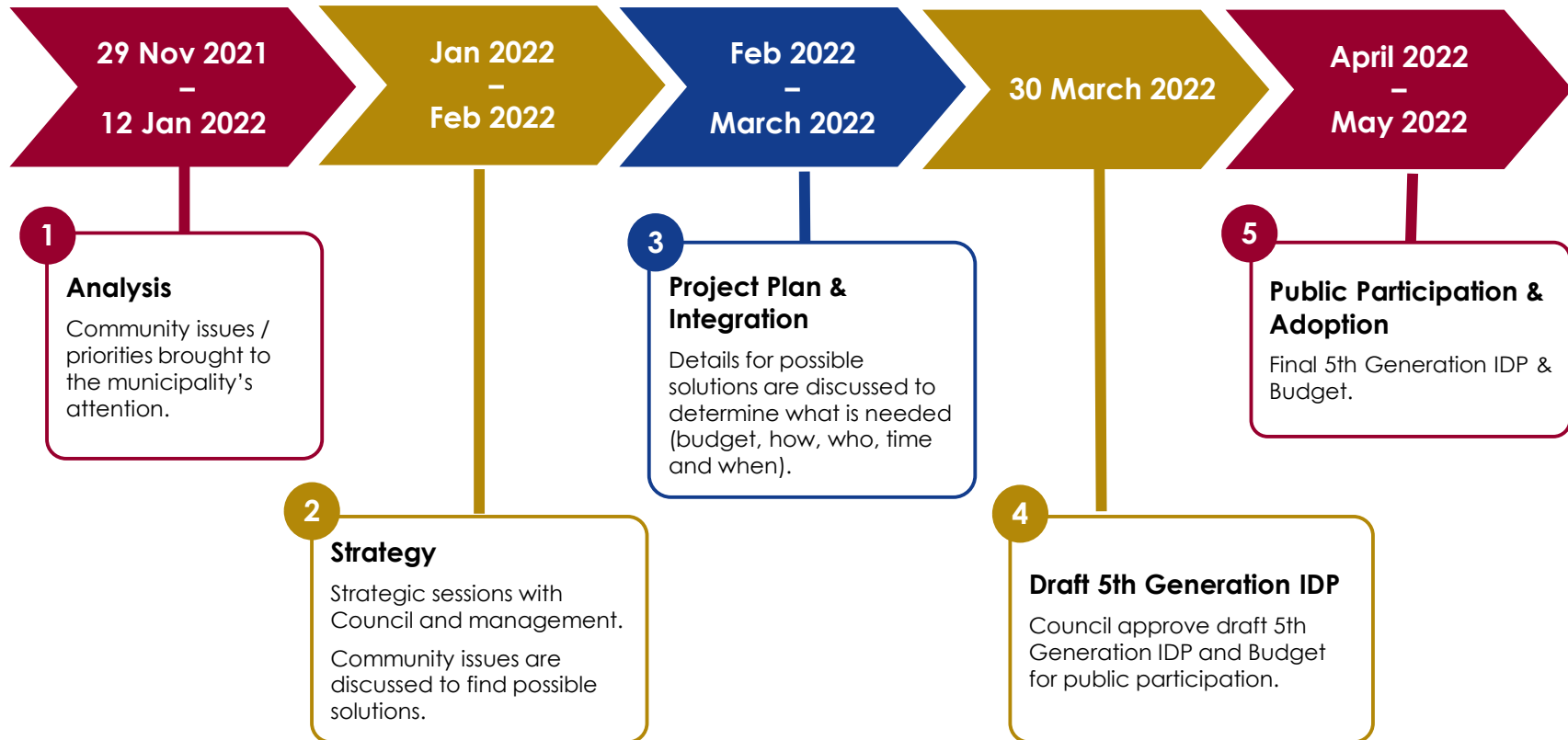
- (i) The local community to be consulted on its development needs and priorities; and
- (ii) the local community to participate in the drafting of the Integrated Development Plan; and organs of state, including traditional authorities, and other role players to be identified and consulted on the drafting of the integrated development plan.



Timeline: 5th Generation IDP 2022 – 2027



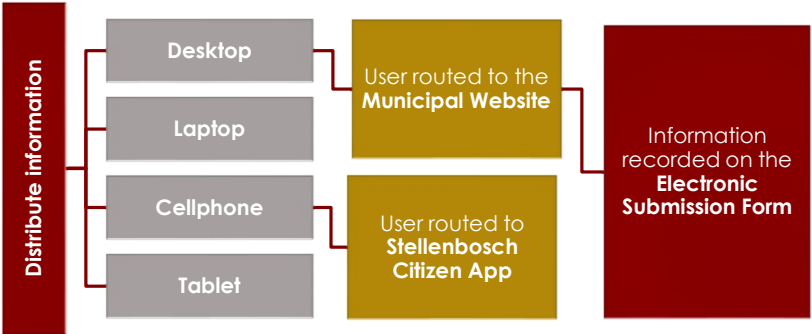
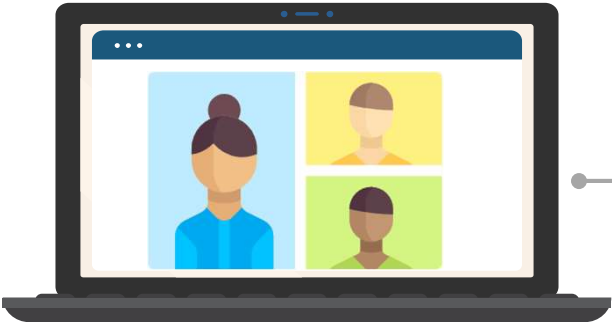

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Unemployment and Job Creation

Job creation, though a serious concern at local government level, is not a municipal mandate, however, the Stellenbosch Municipality continue to create an enabling environment for investment to contribute to job creation through economic development strategies and business development

Currently, the number of Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) Projects have been increased and additional funding provided to ensure that more job opportunities are created.

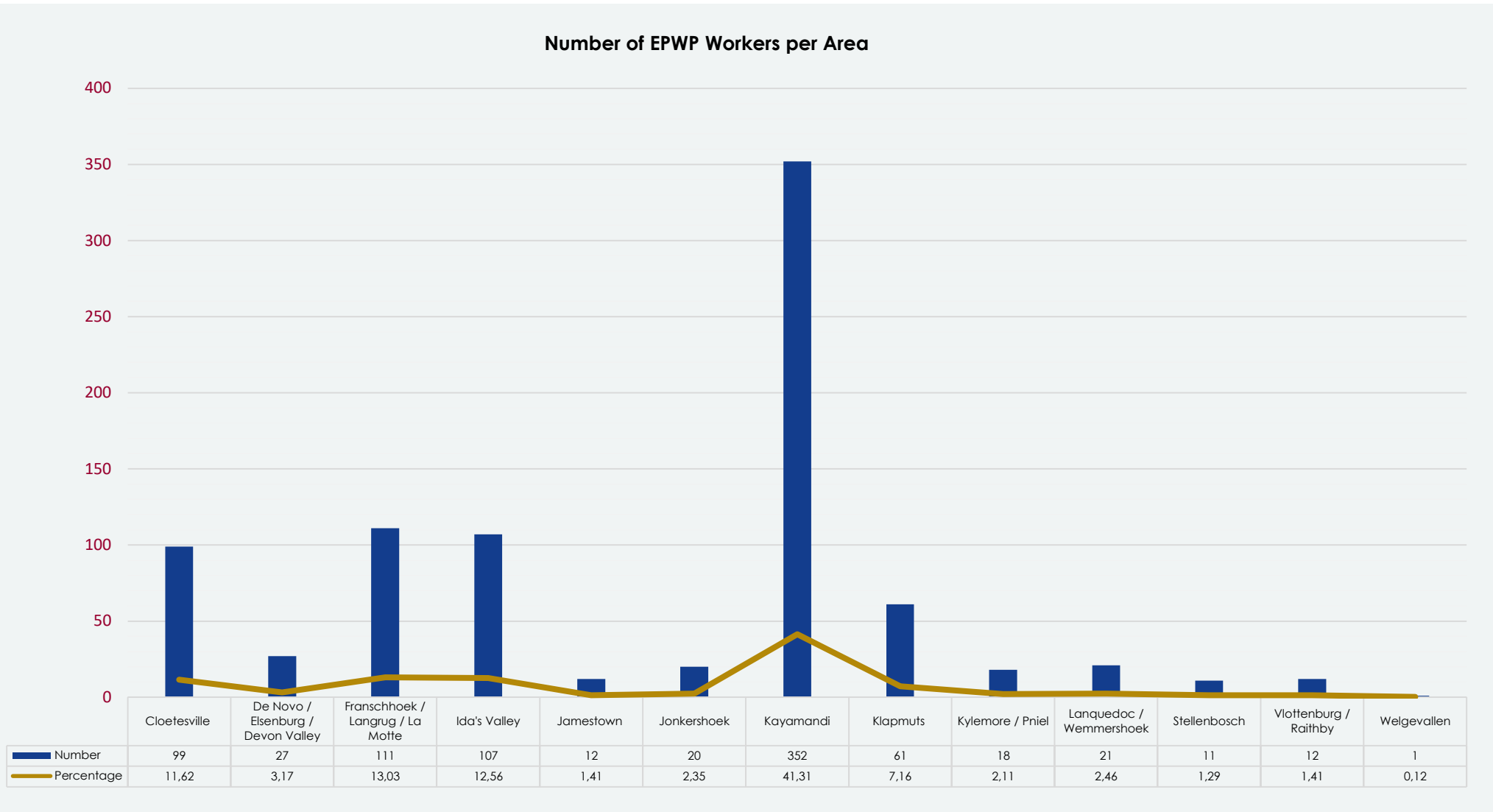
EPWP contracts are awarded in terms of the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the municipality and National Public Works (NPW). The EPWP is therefore different from the Fixed-Term Contracts offered by the municipality.

The municipality will provide EPWP contracts for residents registered on the Municipal Jobseekers Database, and through the database, the municipality can accurately monitor the manner the contracts are allocated by each user department.

Currently, all employment opportunities within the municipality are made available through the Human Resources Policy governing recruitment and selection. There are also other employment mechanisms that are implemented within the municipality through various funding resources, e.g. EPWP, Provincial and National Government funded internships, etc.

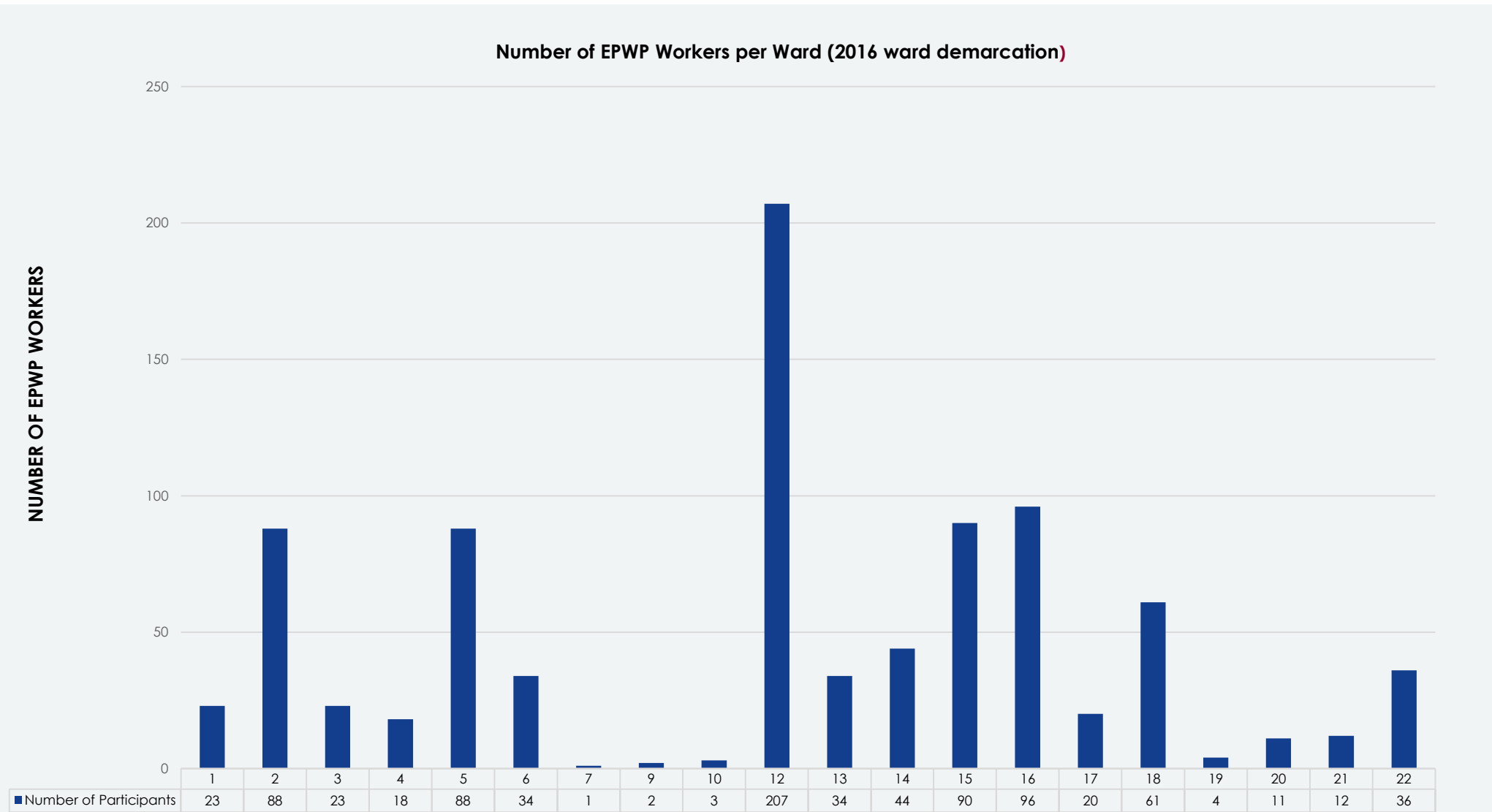


Number of EPWP Workers Per Area (Q1 and Q2 of the 2021/22)





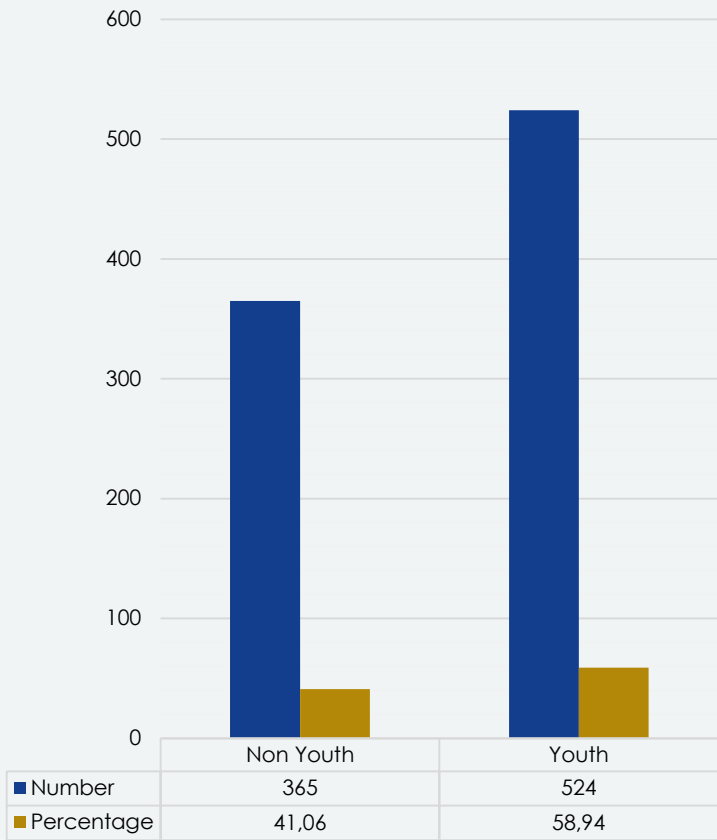
Number of EPWP Workers per Ward (Q1 and Q2 of the 2021/22)



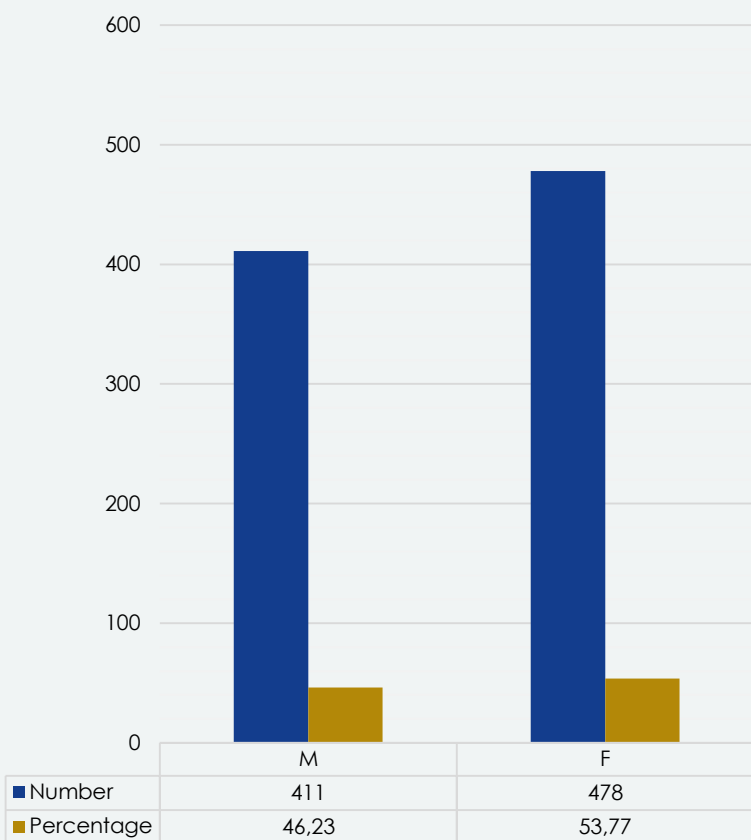


Number of EPWP per Age and Gender Breakdown (Q1 and Q2 of the 2021/22)

Tourism



- The municipality is currently finalising the draft Stellenbosch Municipality Economic Development Strategy, which will undergo a public participation process as part of the IDP process.
- Funding is provided for qualifying Local Tourism Organisations ("LTO"). The request for LTOs to submit proposals for the 2022/23 financial year will be advertised during January 2022.

Local Economic Development



- Currently, industrial park areas are designated within Klapmuts, Cloetesville and Kayamandi. The need for additional light industrial parks must be evaluated and must be inform by the Economic Development Strategy.

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Housing Development

Housing is a challenge as resources and allocations from National and Provincial governments remain limited, and the backlog tremendously.

Backyard Dwellers

- ✦ The Directorate: Infrastructure Services has launched an investigation into the possibilities of providing basic services for backyarders, by taking into account the necessary legislation that prohibits the municipality from working on privately owned land. A backyard dwellers survey was completed during 2020/21 financial year.

Land for housing plots

- ✦ All housing projects are done in accordance with the Housing Pipeline for the entire Municipal area (WC024).
- ✦ The Housing Pipeline as well as guidelines from the National and Provincial Human Settlements Department determine the scale of housing projects.
- ✦ Currently, there is a preference for the regionality (across Wards) and mega-developments and a departure from settlement / neighbourhood-based Housing Projects.

Kayamandi

- ✦ The approved Housing Pipeline has indicated as **two (2)** of its **mega-projects**, being the Northern extension and the Jamestown project to accommodate mixed-use housing developments.
- ✦ To address the housing challenges in the greater Stellenbosch area, these projects namely Northern extension and Jamestown have been identified. As a priority, land use rights must be obtained on both land parcels.



Housing Development

Northern extension

- ✦ A service provider has been appointed to obtain all development rights for the Northern extension. This could be between 5 000 - 6 000 housing opportunities which will include a decanting site.
- ✦ The period to obtain development rights, should if no objections be received, can be between 18 - 24 months.
- ✦ The Northern Extension has been identified as a mega-project to address housing needs in the WCO24 which also includes Zones as identified by the ward councillors and ward committees.
- ✦ The Provincial Department of Human Settlements as part of their beneficiary criteria identified citizens, 60 years and older and the disabled as priority allocations.

Non-qualifiers?

- ✦ The Northern Extension, which will yield between **5 000 - 6 000 housing opportunities**, will also include service sites.
- ✦ The Northern Extension is a mixed-used development.

Zone O structure surveys

- ✦ The required information will be provided to the ward councillor and ward committee taking into account the latest POPI Act.



Housing Development

Town Centre Development

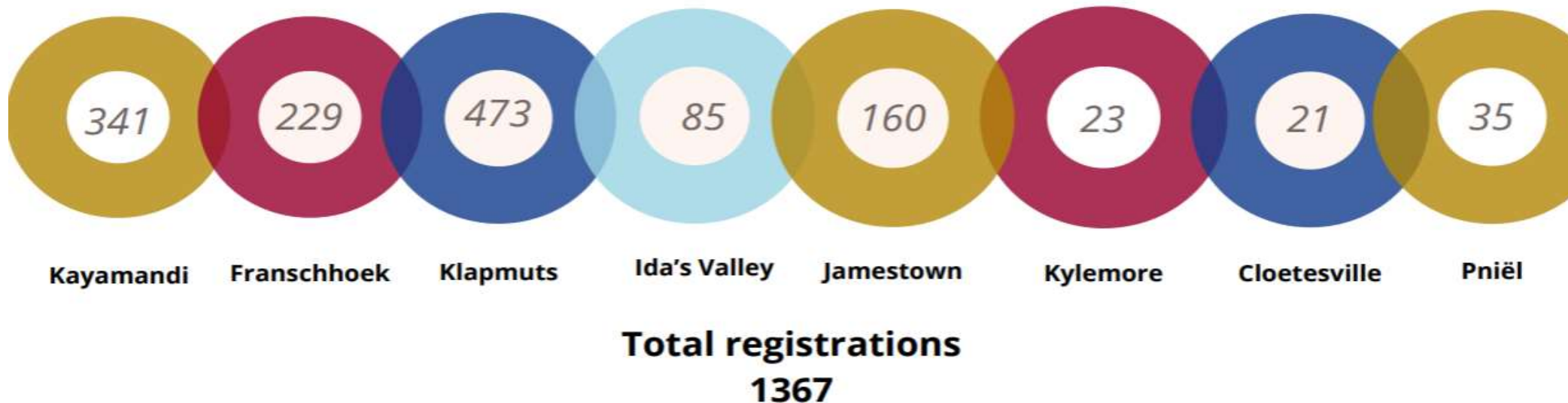
- As part of the Town Centre Development in Kayamandi, 3 to 4 storey BNG also known as RDP walk-ups are part of the overall planning process.
- These housing opportunities will be communicated in conjunction with the public participation process which commenced in 2016/17.
- Cognisance must be taken of the National Department's latest circular whereby the building of new BNG houses on single residential erven will not be supported.
- The service provider is currently in its final stage of submitting the necessary reports to obtain development rights and township establishment for the Kayamandi Town Centre project.
- The Town Centre Development in Kayamandi will make provision for the elderly and disabled beneficiaries as well as take into account formal and informal businesses.



Title Deeds

- The Title Deeds Restoration Programme is currently ongoing. However, challenges have been encountered with deceased owners who have passed on without having a Will in place and dependents failing to report deceased estates at the Office of the Master of the High Court for an estate administrator to be appointed to commence with the transfer process.
- The number of title deeds handed over in these wards during the 1st & 2nd quarters of this financial year **2021/22 amounts to 9.**
- The handover of historical and new title deeds to their rightful beneficiaries is a continuous and ongoing process.

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Cleaning of rivers



WCO24 (Greater Stellenbosch)

- EPWP projects were used to clean all rivers.
- Only vegetation will be removed from river verges by EPWPs teams.

Parks



Kayamandi

- EPWP workers were employed to assist in keeping the parks clean in the Kayamandi areas.
- The municipality is requesting for residents to assist in taking ownership of parks in their surroundings.



Open Spaces

Planting and maintaining of trees

- Trees are managed and maintained as per the annual plan of operations of urban Forestry.
- Trees can only be planted if there is no underground infrastructure and based on the availability of trees.
- The planting of trees is subjected to the wayleave application process.

Swimming Pools

- No space and funding are available on the 2021/22 budget to construct swimming pools.

Cutting of grass

- Cutting grass takes place in a six-week cycle in parks and main roads.

Environmental plans and policies

- Provisions were made in the 2021/22 financial year for Environmental Management Plans to be implemented by conducting Alien Clearing, Firebreak Maintenance and Preparation, River Cleaning and Erosion control.
- Environmental Policies are being enforced to manage the natural environment sustainably.

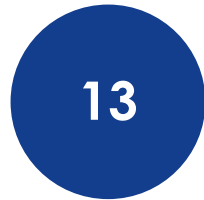

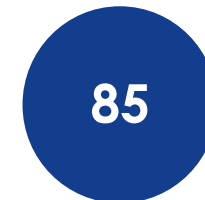

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Water and Wastewater Services

Upgrades and new Bulk Infrastructure

- Relocation / upgrade main water supply Ida's Valley: Completed in February 2020.
- Bulk Sewer Outfall: Jamestown: Completed and a final inspection is in progress.
- New Plankenbrug Main Sewer Outfall Phase 2 and 3: Completed in October 2020.
- Ida's Valley Merriman Outfall Sewer: Completed in October 2020.
- Kayamandi Northern Extension Bulk Water Supply incl. new pump station, bulk pipelines and reservoir: Tender compilation stage
- Waterpipe Replacement: Contractor appointed and replaced water mains in La Colline area. Waterpipe Replacement is ongoing.
- Watergang Informal Settlement- access to basic services: Contractor appointed, expected completion date is 30 June 2022.

Enkanini and Kayamandi Informal Settlement: Ablution maintenance

- A service provider has been appointed, maintenance and disinfection are ongoing. Phasing out of Kayaloos and refurbishment of ablutions are ongoing.

Indigent Household Leak Repair Programme & Water Demand Management Devices

- Indigent households are assisted with internal / private leaks in their property and WDMDs are installed free of charge to allow access to free water.

Borehole augmentation

- The municipality is in the process to obtain Water Use Licence Authorisations (WULAs) to augment the existing water supply from COCT and DWS.



Waste Management

WCO24 (Greater Stellenbosch)

- Door-to-door refuse collection service and area cleaning service is ongoing.

Implementation of Waste Minimisation Projects

- This project is ongoing, with door-to-door household recyclable collections, builders' rubble crushing and green waste shredding at the landfill.

Extension of the landfill site

- This project is in process.
- A Design Engineer has been appointed to undertake the design of the new cells and associated infrastructure.
- Eskom is busy finalising new servitudes for the relocation of the powerlines, which will enable the extension of the landfill site.
- All environmental authorisations have been received.



Electrical Services

Installation of electricity for the backyarders

- ✦ The Department: Electrical Services is providing electricity to backyard dwellers provided that all application conditions and requirements are met, which includes the payment of the connection fee by the owner of the property.

Electricity provision for the informal structures in Zone O, L, J, K

- ✦ The Department: Electrical Services completed the network study to check if there is enough capacity to accommodate additional connections.
- ✦ A request to generate a PO to hire a contractor from the labour tender to start with the connections has been captured.

Streetlights out of order in ward 14

- ✦ Investigation on site took place. Repairs to the sections of lights were completed. However, the problem of street lighting not working is created by the connection of illegal connections, which continues in this area



Electrical Services

Electricity at Masithandane next to the police station

- ✦ All people in need of electricity must submit their application forms to the Informal Settlement Department and an approval process will be followed to have applicants supplied with electricity.

Timeframe of electricity installation in Nkanini

- ✦ The project is under construction, the contractor is 89% complete.
- ✦ A revised final project programme is pending.



Roads, Transport & Stormwater (RTS) and Traffic Engineering

WCO24 (Greater Stellenbosch)

Traffic Calming

Traffic Calming feasibility studies and assessments have been carried out, implementation is scheduled for the 2nd and 3rd quarters of the 2021/22 financial year.

Roads, Stormwater and Traffic Engineering

In terms of available capital and operational budget, approved for the 2021/22 financial year, the following departmental programmes are currently underway:

- ✦ Road and Periodic Reseal Programme; and
- ✦ Intersection Improvements (planning currently underway for the next round of intersection upgrades).

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Safety and Security

Neighbourhood Watches (NHW)

- † NHW volunteers are being sought.
- † The department assists with the registration of new NHWs. CPF establishment is a SAPS competency.
- † The department has assisted the group of community members in Costaland to establish and accredit the NHW Costa Patrol.
- † The municipality is currently busy preparing to issue NHWs with operational equipment.
- † The municipality is focusing on different areas in Kayamandi to present and recruit more members to join hands and establish NHWs.

The training of NHW members have been prioritised in conjunction with the Department of Community Safety and Stellenbosch Municipality and is in progress. When this is done, the focus will shift to school safety.

- † Ward 12: No accredited neighbourhood watch.
- † Ward 13: Have a Costa Patrol accredited neighbourhood watch, did not receive any equipment as the neighbourhood watch was recently registered.
- † Ward 14: No accredited neighbourhood watch.
- † Ward 15: No accredited neighbourhood watch.



Safety and Security

School Patrols

- † Traffic Services do random patrols in all areas.
- † However, due to limited staff resources, regular patrols around schools cannot be guaranteed on a continuous basis.
- † The municipality does assist with the training of scholar patrols where it is required and safe to do so.
- † Discussions took place between Stellenbosch Municipality and the Department of Community Safety for the implementation of the walking bus project in the area.

Installation of CCTV cameras

Cameras are monitored. A Camera Master Plan has been developed which will guide the placing and installation of future CCTV cameras.

- † Ward 12: The camera close to Happy Rest which was damaged during a fire will be replaced, waiting on Department ICT to replace the network infrastructure. Cameras have been delivered. All other camera installations for the ward is completed and cameras are up and running.
- † Ward 13: All cameras are installed and are in working condition, cameras will be upgraded at the entrance to Kayamandi as it is due for an upgrade.
- † Ward 14: All cameras installed and is in working condition.
- † Ward 15: All cameras installed and is in working condition.



Safety and Security

Criminal and illegal activities

- † Safety and security is a primary function of SAPS.
- † The Municipal Law Enforcement is there to assist.
- † As the neighbourhood watch has recently been accredited, joint patrols are performed.
- † However, operations are performed throughout the Greater Stellenbosch, and it includes Wards 12, 13, 14 and Ward 15.

Appointment and Delegation of Law Enforcement Officers

- † The appointment of additional staff is subject to funding.
- † Temporary Peace Officers were appointed in the CBD for the Parking Project.

Smoke alarms

- † Smoke alarms were installed in certain sections. The project is continuing.

Risk assessment

- † Disaster risk assessment was conducted in all wards.

WCO24 (Greater Stellenbosch): Give Responsibly

A campaign to stop the cash economy on the street, give in a dignified way to persons on the street who need access to social services and a warm bed, shower facilities and access to social work services.

- ✦ The Cheese App (an electronic coupon) has been developed to assist with taking cash off the streets. This means that a resident can now assist some homeless persons without being in the vicinity of a retail partner selling coupons.
- ✦ Currently, **15 local businesses support** the campaign through the sale of coupons.
- ✦ **Five marketing** videos are used on different platforms to educate the public on the campaign.
- ✦ Animal Welfare Stellenbosch – Walk a dog in exchange for a coupon. The project started towards the end of the financial year with almost **56 persons benefitting**. One person gained full-time employment through the project, and one was temporarily employed as a driver.

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Spatial Development Framework (SDF) Amendment Process



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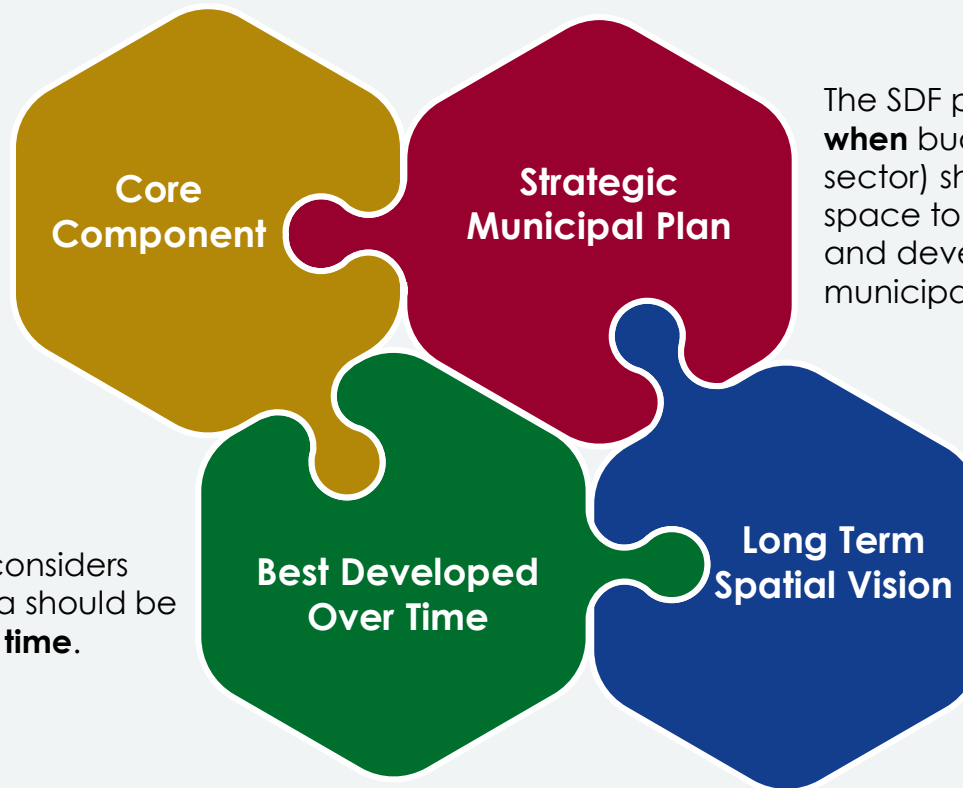
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Relationship between the SDF & IDP

The SDF is a **core component** that is part of the IDP. Council adopted to amend the SDF for the **new 5-year IDP term** → **29 September 2021**.



The SDF provides guidance on **where** and **when** budget (of all government & private sector) should be spent in the municipal space to **achieve** spatial transformation and developmental outcomes of the municipality.

Importantly the SDF considers how a municipal area should be **best developed over time**.

The SDF provides a map of the **long-term spatial vision** and a path to get there.



SDF Amendment Process

The need to amend the SDF arose from the review of the SDF and other municipal strategic plans, policies, and decisions (i.e. Housing Pipeline, Inclusionary Housing, ATC etc.).

The changing circumstances requires an amendment of the 2019 adopted SDF to ensure strategic alignment with the new Council's delivery compact which is informed by the needs, interests & priorities of communities and service delivery departments.

The amendment of an SDF will be prepared as part of the municipality's IDP in accordance with the legislative provisions, namely – MSA, SPLUMA, WC: LUPA, & SM: MPBL.

The process that will be followed as set out & approved in the 2022 – 2023 IDP Process Plan will be the Project Steering Committee and not an IGR.

All stakeholders, government departments & the public will be consulted & afforded opportunities to make representations during the process.

Municipal Demarcation Board

Municipal Boundary Redetermination



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- ✦ The **Municipal Demarcation Board (MDB)** determines municipal boundaries in accordance with the Municipal Demarcation Act (MDA, 1998).
- ✦ Following the 2021 Local Government Elections the MDB **municipal boundary redetermination is now open.**
- ✦ All stakeholders and members of the public who wish to submit proposals may do so from **now until 31 March 2022.**
- ✦ Proposals submitted must be motivated i.t.o. Section 24 and 25 of the MDA and Section 2 of the Municipal Structures Act. Proposals to be addressed for the attention of the Chairperson of the MDB:

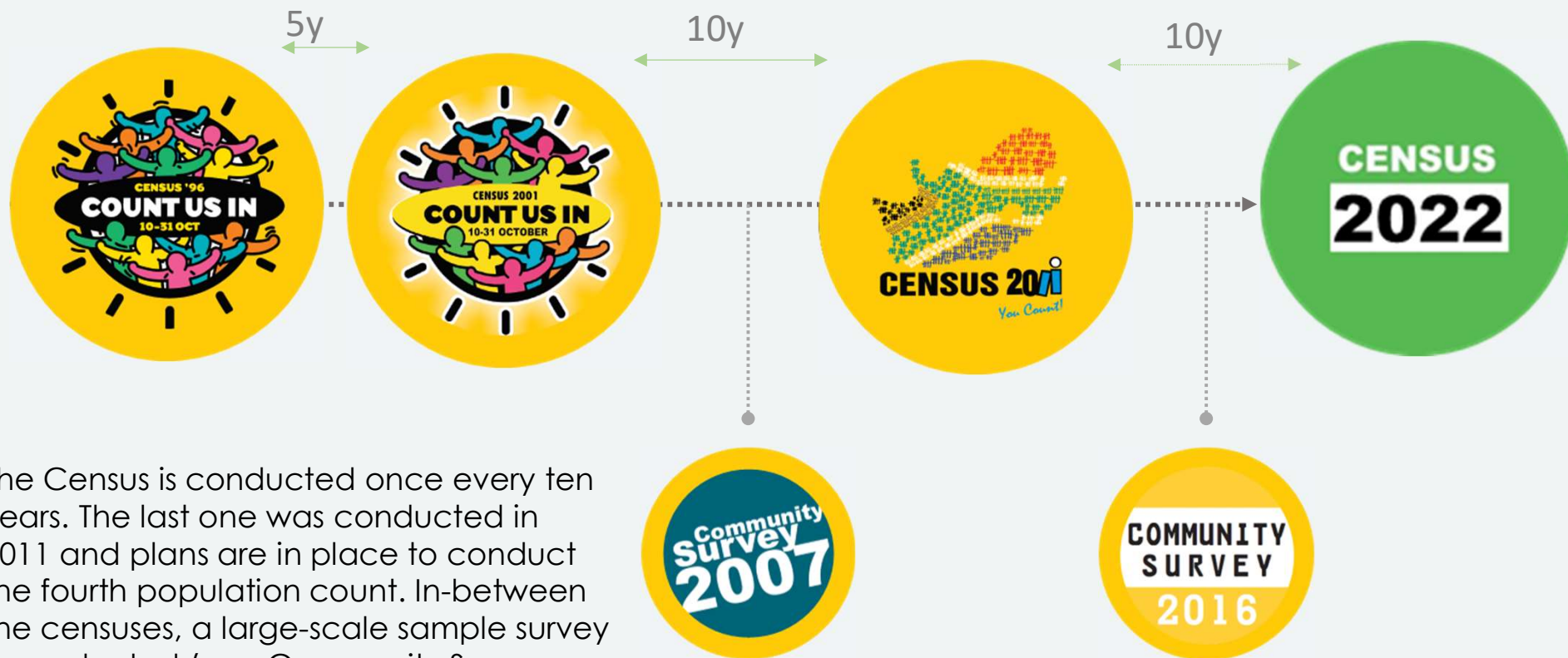
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Censuses and large-scale surveys from 1994

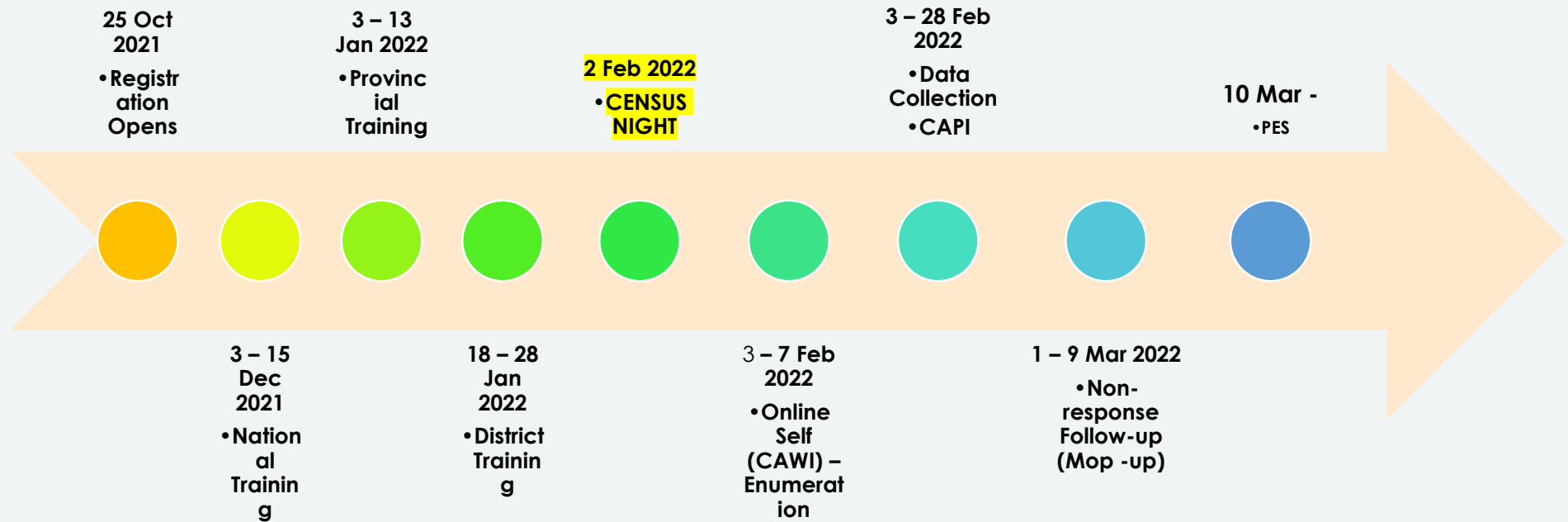
